2005 Distinguished Graduate Blends Diversity, Leadership and Scholarship

The first thing to know about Abeer Abdalla, who has been named this year's distinguished graduate, is that she loves defying the norm.

At 23, Ms. Abdalla has amassed a list of accomplishments that have made her a valuable presence at Valencia. In 2003 she co-authored and published *Millennial Manifesto: A Youth Activist Handbook*, that is now in its second printing following a favorable coverage in Entrepreneur magazine and on the CBS Morning Show.

Graduating with a 3.76 GPA, Abdalla made the National Dean's List in 2004 and was nominated to the All-USA Academic Team. She has been recognized as one of the top ten distinguished Phi Theta Kappa members in Florida, receiving numerous chapter awards including the Servant-Leader Award, the Outstanding Inductee Award and the most spirited Inductee Award. She is the first ever Valencia student, and one of 20 students in the nation to be selected as a 2005 Guistwhite Scholar and has received a \$5,000 stipend toward her undergraduate education.

She describes Valencia in terms of the possibilities it afforded her: "Where but Valencia can John Stossel, noted television personality, match wits with a young man on sexism and economic sustainability? Where but Valencia do those who once feared mathematics return to share their experiences as NASA physicists? Here I have met students from more than 30 countries and all 50 states. The faculty and administration have guided me beyond the

classroom and helped cultivate my willingness to change the world."

It is a world that Abdalla hopes to change as a documentary filmmaker, a career she decided on while watching news coverage in the aftermath of September 11. "As an Arab-American, I want to bridge the gap between the story and the truth. I want to show the reality of duality, what it means to be both an Arab and an American. I want to tell the stories of hyphenated Americans everywhere."

Abdalla received her \$600 Distinguished Graduate Award from the Alumni Association June 1 at the annual Alumni Achievers Reception. That same night, she was elected to the Board of Directors at the Alumni Association's Annual meeting.

Former Valencia Student Awarded Medal of Valor

Prior to becoming a detective in the Orange County Sheriff's Office, Jennifer Fulford-Salvano completed her law enforcement officer training at Valencia's Criminal Justice Institute, graduating in 1993. She went on to earn her Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from the University of Central Florida.

Fulford-Salvano was awarded the Public Safety Officer Medal of Valor, the nation's highest award bestowed upon public service officers, during a ceremony at the White House on July 14, 2005. She has the distinction of being the only woman ever to have received this award.

Detective Fulford-Salvano responded to a burglary in progress call May 5, 2004, after an 8-year-old boy called 911 to say "strange men" were in his home in Pine Hills with weapons and that he and his sister were hiding inside a van in the garage. She entered the garage to check on the children, and two men emerged from the house firing their weapons. Trapped in the garage, she returned fire. She was struck a total of ten times, including in her shooting hand. She was still able to retrieve her weapon with her other hand and continue

firing until both gunmen went to the ground. The children were kept safe and unharmed throughout the incident.

Fulford-Salvano maintains her connection to Valencia as a part-time instructor at the Criminal Justice Institute and as a member of the Alumni Association. "I believe that my life experience can serve as an excellent educational tool. Valencia is a great place to start because going straight to a university can be overwhelming for anyone just out of high school, or even the adult that has been out of school for a while. Plus it's more affordable."
